Helpline for people in crisis- for anyone who is 'shielding' and has concerns about their access to food and medicine or they are feeling isolated and require support. SHIELDING

The NHS have been contacting people who are extremely vulnerable to COVID-19 because they have a serious health condition. These people being advised to stay indoors and avoid contact with others for 12 weeks, during which time they will receive regular deliveries of food and medicines as part of a national support scheme. Anyone who feels they should be classed as 'extremely vulnerable' but has not received a letter from the NHS or been contacted by their GP is advised to speak to their GP or hospital clinician.

Domestic abuse The Police have reported an increase in incidents of domestic abuse nationally since COVID-19 and people being asked to stay home. The Silent Solution is for victims of domestic abuse who might be afraid of further danger and escalation of harm if they are overheard when calling 999 in an emergency. When somebody calls 999, an operator will ask which emergency service is required. If the caller is unable to audibly signal to the operator, the call will be forwarded to an operating system. If 55 is pressed by the caller, the system will detect this. The operator will then transfer the call to the relevant police force as an emergency.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

Firstly, and probably most important of all, we want to look after our neighbours. Do check on your neighbours and keep in regular touch. We all need to make sure we have someone to contact if needed.

Do you have a medical background? If a neighbour or someone in the Parish is unwell, would you be happy to give advice or support medically? If you are prepared to do this, let us know and we may put you in contact with someone needing advice and support.

Keep up to date with latest advice and information on Government, NHS and Rutland County Council websites and share this with anyone who does not have internet access.
