### Parking around our schools

PC Orton, PC Robinson & PCSO Freeman have responded to complaints of dangerous and inconsiderate parking in the area of Langham primary school.

Rutland Neighbourhood police teams kindly ask that you follow the guidance below.

- DO park in a considerate and safe manner, do not park in such a way as to block access and across dropped kerbs.
- DO NOT park at junctions, on bends and brows of hills
- DO NOT park on the pavement causing an obstruction to pedestrians.
- DO NOT park on grass verges causing a danger to other road users.
- DO NOT stop or park on pedestrian crossing their zigzags or on school zigzags
- DO NOT park on a road where there are no overtaking markings I the centre of the road.
- DO NOT park on the white hatched areas or double park.

If everyone follows these guidelines around all our schools it will make dropping off and collecting your child a much safer process.
