Section 1 of the AGAR was completed as approved on 15/05/2023 with a minute reference 13702c. Section 2 of the AGAR was dated as approved on the same day and had a minute reference of 13702b. On investigation (due to the minute reference of Section 2 being before Section 1), a copy of the minutes were found on the Parish Council's website that clearly show both Sections 1 and 2 were approved at the Full Council Meeting on 15 May 2023 in minute reference 13702c.

As such, the minute reference entered on Section 2 of the AGAR is incorrect. We would expect this to be considered in the council's response to Assertion 3 on the 2023-24 return.
